HOUSING

\$922,100 invested into mold remediation

- Assisted NC Housing Authority in securing funds to rehabilitate more than 25 multi-family housing units in Aneta, Lakota, McVile, Michigan, Petersburg and Tolna

COMMUNITY BETTERMENT

More than \$221,562 secured for local services

- Grants and sponsorships supported daycares, grocery stores, city owned buildings and businesses, and special events



INFRASTRUCTURE

\$1.3 million invested into public infrastructure

- Secured \$681k in grants to replace fire hydrants, street lights, and update HVAC and address handicap accessibility in public buildings.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Secured \$114,196 to help keep our communities safe

- \$65,086 for protective equipment for Lakota Volunteer Fire Department
- Early warning sirens in Michigan and Pekin

TOURISM AND RECREATION

Total investment of \$1.2 million

- Bank stabilization and new playground at Stump Lake Cafe
- New construction of Stump Lake Cafe



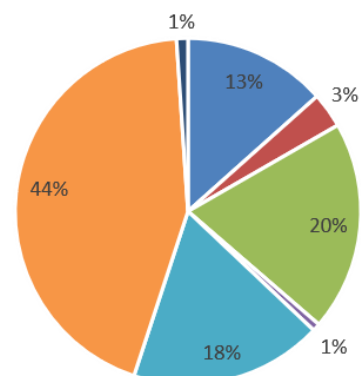
BUSINESS
