


North Dakota Rural Catalyst Grants

\$2.5 MILLION TO NINE AWARDEES

- **Bowman County Fire Department:** \$500,000

ND Rural Catalyst Program

Nine rural communities will receive \$2.5 million through the Rural Catalyst Grant Program to advance locally-driven projects that strengthen community vitality and economic resiliency.

The Rural Catalyst Fund was initiated by the ND Association of Regional Councils with SB 2390 to support quality of life in small towns statewide. SB 2390 was sponsored by Senators Wanzek, Myrdal, and Thomas and Representatives Brandenburg, Beltz, and Kempenich. The original bill sought \$30 million.

18 applications submitted from Region 4

Among the 94 applications totaling \$18 million submitted statewide, 18 applicants were submitted from Region 4 in Northeast North Dakota. **Four projects were awarded in Region 4 totaling \$1,119,811.**
